Operating and maintenance information

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

InterLace® 6000 Series Vertical Louvre Blinds are reliable systems that are smooth and easy to operate in any of the control options.

Standard Cord and Chain Operation Vertical Blinds

The blind is operated by means of the cord and chain positioned at the end of the blind headrail. Gently pull on the cord to draw the louvres across. To tilt the louvres, gently pull on the chain until the desired angle is reached.

Mono Wand Operation Vertical Blinds

Grasp the wand and manually draw the louvres across in a gentle manner, ensuring the louvres do not catch on anything. Twist the wand to tilt the louvres to the desired angle.

Crank Operation Vertical Blinds

Take the rigid handle and fold the bottom part to form a handle. Holding the sleeved section of the bar in one hand, gently crank the handle to rotate the blind mechanism and draw or retract the blind to the parameters as detailed above.

Mono Chain Operation Vertical Blinds

The single looped chain is used to draw the louvres, and tilt them. Pull gently on the chain until the desired positions are reached.

Electric Motorised Operation Vertical Blinds

Using the switch provided, utilise the control buttons to draw or retract the blind to the desired position. To tilt the louvres, press button and hold until desired louvre angle is reached.

InterLace® 6000 Series Vertical Blinds are designed to be maintenance free.

Fabric Care

Where fabric is soiled, contact InterLace® for specific cleaning instructions. Dust can be vacuumed, taking care, from the fabric surface.

Lubrication

If operation becomes slow or stiff, a small amount of InterLace® approved lubricant can ease the running of certain components as systems begin to age.

Note: Please be aware that although designed for intensive use, blinds are by nature delicate items and should be treated with respect. If at any point a mechanism becomes jammed or will not operate for any reason, contact InterLace® on **0800 619 6999** for advice. Do not ever force as this will potentially result in further damage.

InterLace® state that an annual check should be carried out by a competent person, to ensure that the blinds operate in the correct way, that any fabric is undamaged and ensure that any parts requiring replacement are fitted as soon as possible.

Spare parts of replaceable components and an approved lubricant are available from InterLace® on **0800 619 6999**.
